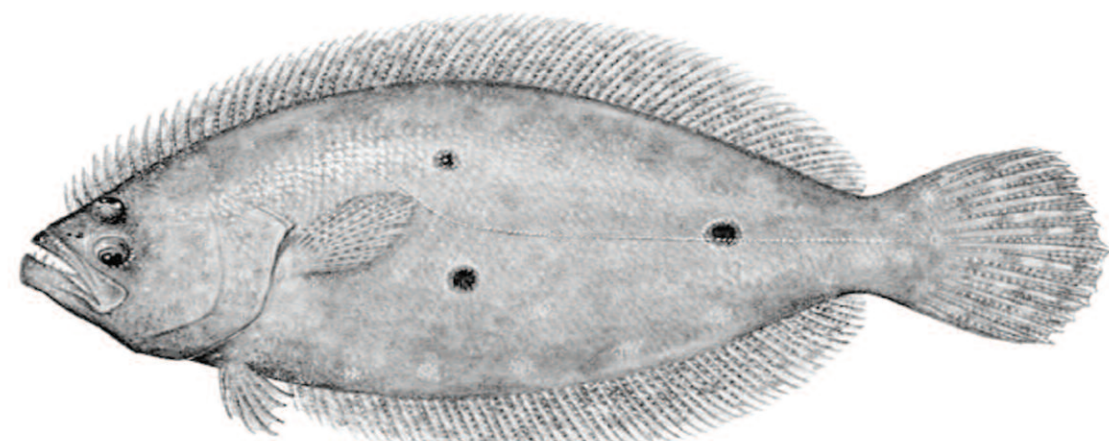

2019 NJ Minimum Size, Possession Limits & Seasons

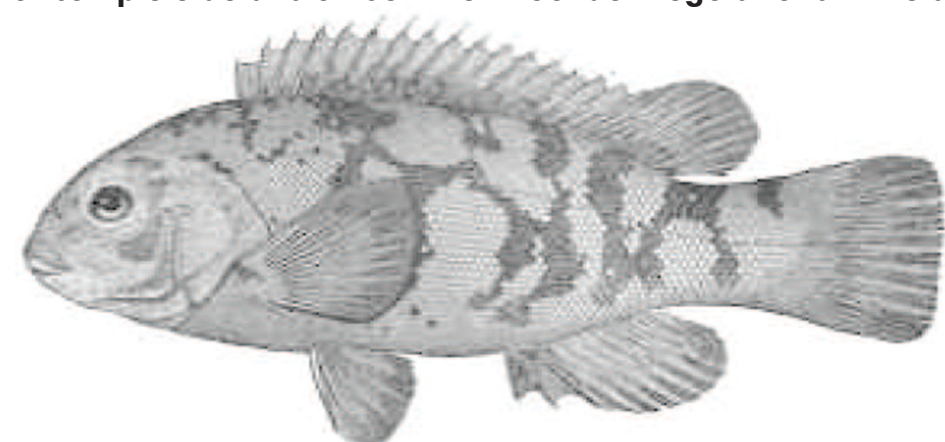


Weakfish
1 fish at 13 inches
Open Season Jan. 1 - Dec. - 31



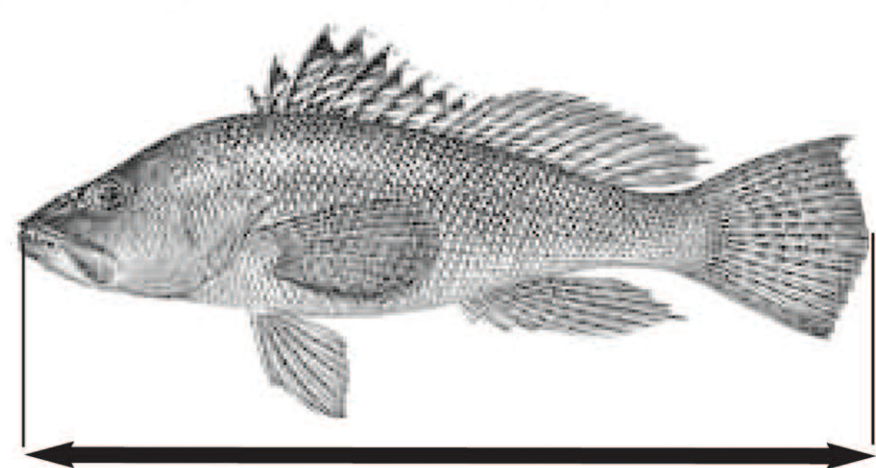
Summer Flounder (Fluke)
3 fish at 18 inches
Open Season May 24 - Sept. 21

Except for Delaware Bay & Tributaries - 3 fish limit at 17" Island Beach State Park from Shore - 2 fish limit at 16"

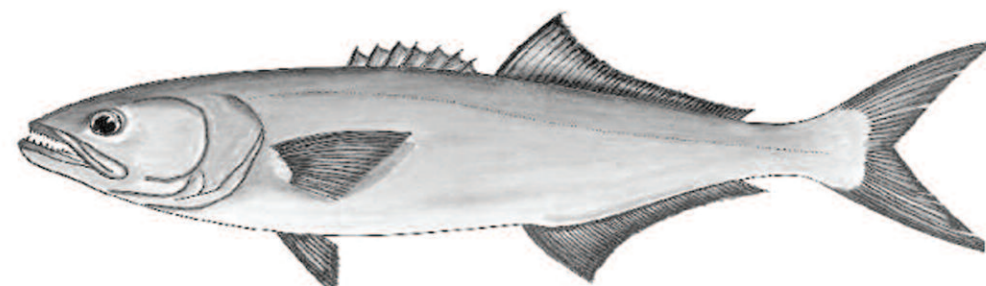
Tautog (Blackfish) 15 inches

Bag Limit	Season
4 fish	Jan. 1 - Feb. 28
4 fish	Apr. 1 - Apr. 30
1 fish	Aug. 1 - Nov. 15
5 fish	Nov. 16 - Dec. 31



Black Sea Bass

10 fish at 12.5 inches	May 15 - Jun. 22
2 fish at 12.5 inches	Jul. 1 - Aug. 31
10 fish at 12.5 inches	Oct. 8 - Oct. 31
15 fish at 13 inches	Nov. 1 - Dec. 31



Bluefish (Snapper)

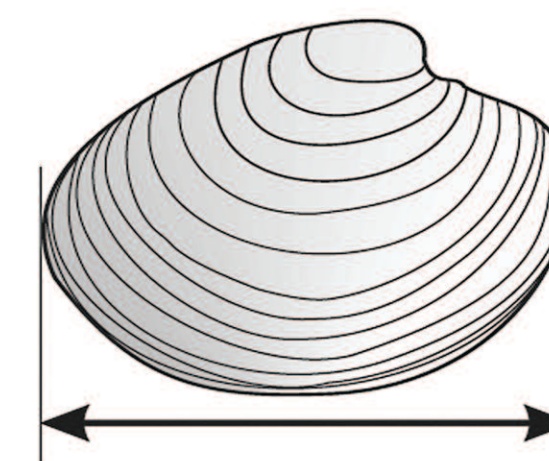
15 fish No minimum size
Open Season Jan. 1 - Dec. 31

Fish are measured from tip of snout to tip of tail (except Black Sea Bass and Sharks).
Cleaning or filleting of fish with a minimum size limit while at sea is prohibited.



Striped Bass or Hybrid Striped Bass

1 fish at 28 inches to less than 43 inches 1 fish 43 inches or greater
Delaware River & Tribs. - Upstream of Calhoun St. Bridge
Open Mar. 1 - Dec. 31
Trenton Calhoun St. Bridge to Salem River & Tribs.
Open Mar 1- Mar. 31 & June 1 - Dec. 31
(0-3 Miles from shore) No closed season
Atlantic Ocean (Greater than 3 miles from Shore) Closed all year
All other marine waters, open Mar. 1 - Dec. 31

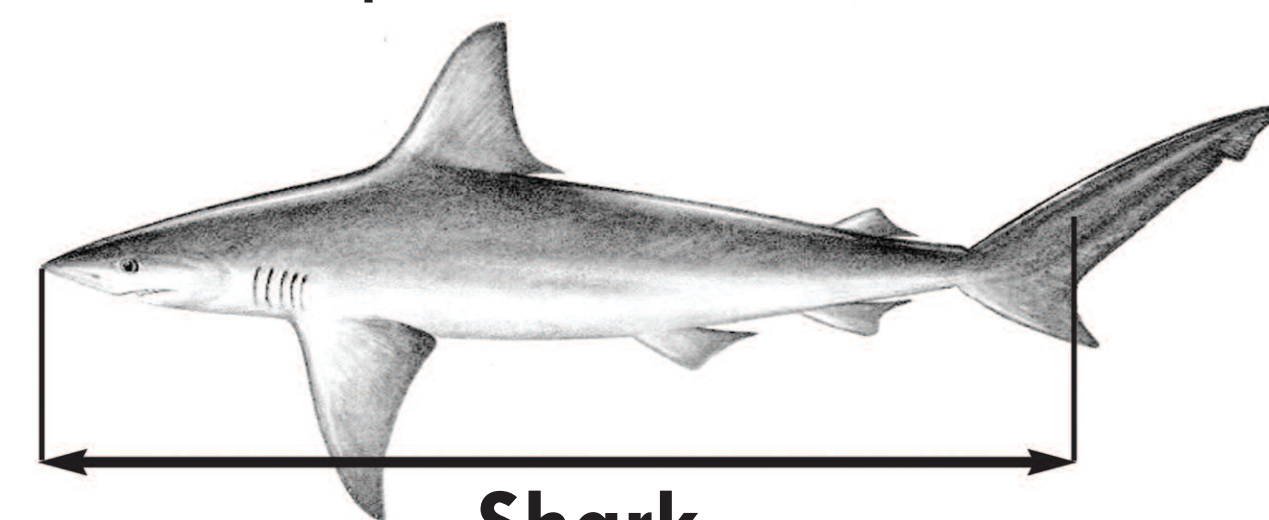
Hard Clam

No harvest on Sunday Shellfish license required



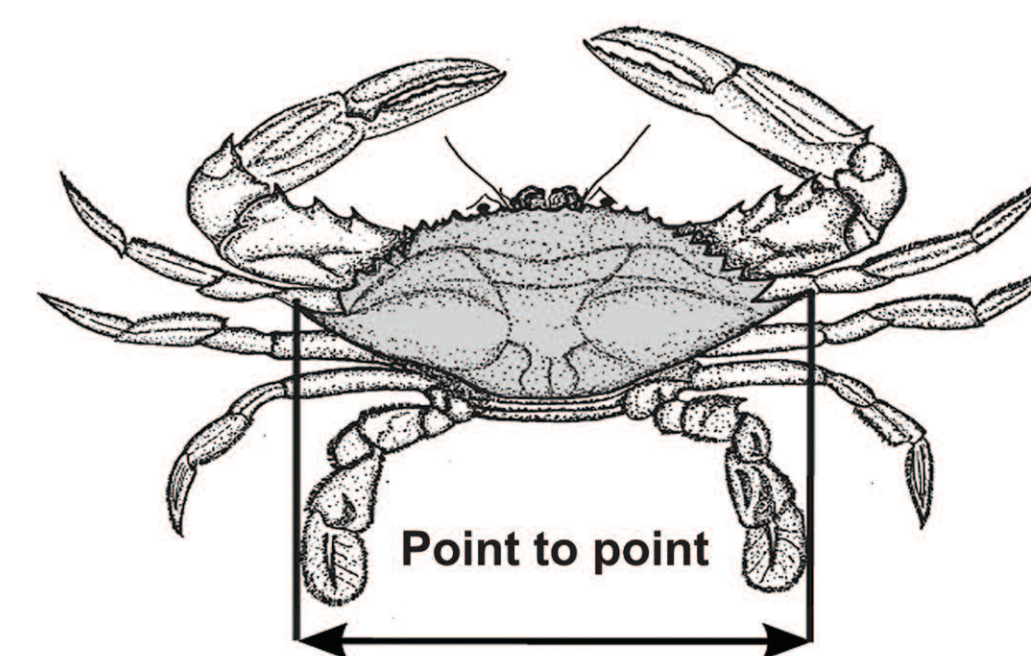
Winter Flounder

Open Season Mar. 1- Dec. 31

Recreational Limit - one bushel

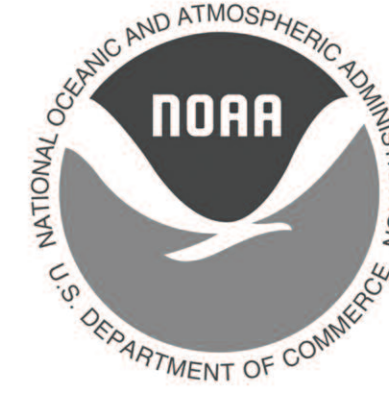

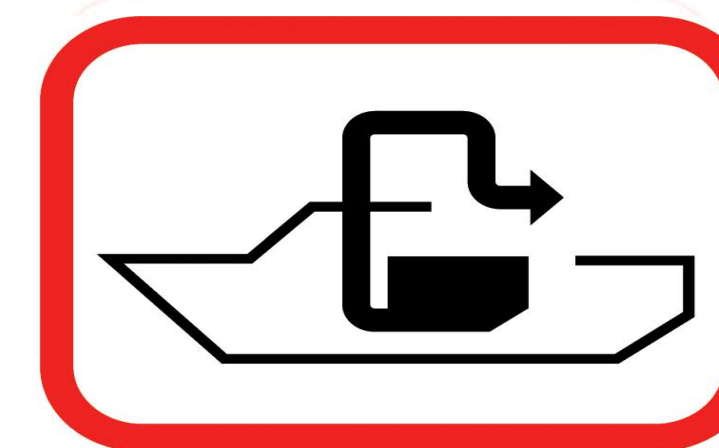
